Spotlight on Services

➤ Project Based Labour Market Client

Training: The objective of Project Based Labour Market Training (PBLMT) is to assist eligible clients, under a project-based training model, to obtain the skills and experience necessary for employment. Through a combination of classroom instruction and on-the-job work experience (where appropriate) delivered in a supported project-based training model, clients are able to build on existing skills and increase their network of potential employers. PBLMT projects are intended to benefit local communities and eligible clients who reside in those communities.



Getting Started: Call one of our WorkBC centres to make an appointment with an Employment Counsellor or inquire about PBLMT. Port Alberni – 250-724-4560, Ucluelet - 250-726-4243 or Tofino - 250-725-8805.

➤ Single Parent Employment Initiative:

If you are a single parent receiving income or disability assistance, you may be eligible for training and support to secure a long-term job through the Single Parent Employment Initiative. To qualify for the funded training, you must have been on assistance for at least three months. You may also be eligible if you already have a post-secondary degree but cannot find a job in your field. Your WorkBC Centre will work with you to help you find a job with your current skill set or help you develop a plan for further training if required.



Supports include:

- Up to 12 months of funded training or paid work experience
- Continued income or disability assistance while in training
- Child care costs covered during your training or work placement and for the first year of employment
- Transit costs to and from school
- WorkBC Employment Services Centre supports, including workshops on resume writing, interview and work preparation
- Health supplement coverage for a full year after you leave income assistance for employment.
- Exemptions for bursaries, grants and scholarships when you are in an approved training program
